
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### Albatross Class:




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
### Caracara Class:

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### Falcon Class:

It has been lovely to welcome back all of the children after a well earned Easter break. This week, the children have been introduced to our new science topic Forces and Magnets and have been given the opportunity to investigate how these different forces act on the things surrounding us. We looked at magnetic forces, electrostatic forces and push and pull forces. In English, we have started to read our class book, The Cook, The Prince and the Cunning King. We have discussed how the pictures and vocabulary show that the story is set in a different time to the present and used dictionaries to find the meanings of unknown words. In history, the children completed a police line up of images and had to guess which ones were Henry VIII based on primary sources of evidence (descriptions), before completing a timeline of Henry's life.



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### Meadowlark Class:


A short and busy week for Meadowlarks. Statistics and representing data are the order of the week in maths, and in English we are half way through our build up to writing and presenting (like David Attenborough) a narrative based on the lives of wolves.

We have started our new science topic which is electricity; we have been experimenting building circuits and identifying the components and their associating symbols. We also investigated what happens to the components when the voltage is changed.

Thank you to the two soldiers from the RIC, who presented and inspired Meadowlarks during their presentation. We all learned so much about their role in the military and how important their level of physical fitness needs to be to carry the weight of their armour and weaponry. Very impressive!
