
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



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Caracara Class:

For geography, we have started to learn about Zambia, which will lead us into what it's like to live in a village in the next few weeks.

In maths, the year 3 children have completed their learning on Measurement and Capacity and have moved on to adding and subtracting fractions, whilst year 4 have been completing their Money topic. In English, they have written some lovely character descriptions of a rather unsavoury character, making him sound as disgusting as possible and using similes. Our history lesson this week was great fun. The children learned about Henry VIII's six wives. They wrote down and discussed good and bad points of each, before giving them a rating out of ten. They also learned the reasons why Henry married so many times and were surprised to find out that not everyone married for love. In RE the children discussed their reasoning about what a 'soul' is and how Christians should live their lives to ensure that their soul would go to heaven. Thank you to Stanley Museum Past Finders who thoroughly entertained the children on Thursday afternoon, they all seemed to have a great time and enjoyed having the company of Stanley school children.
